

Inspired by this tradition, Cranes for Cancer is a small organization located in Arizona that is dedicated to providing boxes of cranes to cancer patients in order to "bring hope and uplift spirits". Damien Key Club joined hands with Waipahu Key Club, Kapolei Key Club and Alaka'i Young Professionals with Damien folding 1,042 cranes out of the 2,057 that was sent to the organization.

Thank you for writing a letter! LETTERS FOR ORPHANS


