


awareness about suicide prevention, remembering those affected by suicide, and focusing one's efforts into directing streatment to those who need it the most. Suicide is known to be one of the leading causes of death in the United States, iwth it being the second leading cause of death for teenagers. Because of this, members of Damien's Key Club created infographics to raise suicide prevention awareness which included information about warning signs, symptoms, risk factors, ways to take action, etc.



INFOGRAPHICS

Pediatric trauma is a life-threatening injury to children and is known to be the leading cause of death among children ages fourteen and under in the United States. In 1994, to help those affected by pediatric trauma, CNH established the Pediatric Trauma Program (PTP) to educate and train people in pediatric trauma and injury prevention. Damien Memorial Key Club Members created infographics of either information about PTP or safety infographics for children, raising awareness in order to help reduce the number of those affected by pediatric trauma.



The September Service Challenge was a challenge organized by Division 22 Komohana that, as the name implies, lasted for all 30 days of the month of September. All clubs in the division—Aiea, Castle, Damien, Hanalani, Kailua, Kapolei, Leilehua, McKinley, Mililani, Pearl City, and Waipahu—were invited to join a zoom call where the service challenge would take place daily. By joining the call from 8:00 to 9:00 PM and participating in the projects, one would be able to earn one hour of service. The following day, on the 5th, Christian Andres and Zoe Hama<mark>da led "Send a Smile to a</mark> Cancer Patient". On the 22nd, Patricia Foronda and Arimathea Bennet led "Birthday Cards for Homeless Children". "Holiday Cards for Hospitalized Kids" was led by Rhusel Rivera and Christine Nguyen on the 28th. Through these calls, members were able to earn hours all while getting more familiarized with members from the other clubs in the division.
